
To round off the day, and as part of a nation-wide event, the evening will draw to a close with the lighting of the village beacon on the Playing Field at 9.30pm.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Rookery Ruckus...

If you go down in the woods today - down to the village's Millennium Wood, that is... There won't be any bears... However, you will notice, by the raucous overhead cacophony, the constant squabbling and the widely strewn building material littering the boardwalk, that the rooks have returned to the rookery.

Quite what the ruckus is all about, we don't really know. Maybe it's just *joie-de-vivre* - party atmosphere - happy rooks! Or perhaps it's territorial - Get outta my tree! Rooks do typically mate for life and return to their preferred nesting sites year after year, vying for the highest vantage point.

So, why do rooks live in colonies? A number of birds, especially seabirds form communal nesting sites, partly because it provides them with protection from predators, but also for the social environment. Rooks are especially sociable birds, and nesting in a rookery allows them to more easily share tasks, such as look-outs and the defence of their young.

On the Guinness superlatives scale our rookery, with about dozen individuals, however, is mere chicken feed - Buckenham woodland in Norfolk has been recorded as hosting up to 80,000 birds... Now that is something to crow about!

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

A popular local event for many years over the May Bank Holiday at the end of May* was the annual Welford Steam Rally, which was hosted by the Coventry Gliding Club on Husbands Bosworth airfield. The event was a major attraction, running from 1970 when a group of local steam enthusiasts, who had been exhibiting their engines at the annual Welford Carnival approached the Gliding Club committee, with a view to widening the scope of their interest with a joint-venture flying and steam fair.

There was some surprise when the first event attracted 2,800 visitors, but over the years the popularity of the event saw visitor numbers top 30,000. By 1980, the event had became a victim of its own success, and the extent of the activity across the site prevented Club members from flying during the weekend. The Club saw the inability to fly, both club flying and providing joy rides, which provided income and publicity for gliding, as a major inconvenience and lost interest in providing a site. Initially a pause was proposed, to be for one year whilst the situation was reviewed. However, the rally organisers cast around for alternative sites with less restrictions and they gladly fell on the offer of a site a few miles down the road, at Hollowell.

We thank Gliding Club stalwart, Sid Gilmore for the aerial view of the first event in 1970, and for his encyclopedic background knowledge ...

* We only had ONE Bank Holiday in May until 1978 when the Labour Government controversially introduced the May Day

holiday at the beginning of the month, which was widely seen at the time as a contentious Socialist ploy.

ALL SAINTS CHURCH

The Lost Son

There is a famous parable about a rich man who had two sons. The younger one itched to get his share of the family estate when his father died and scandalously asked his father to give him his share now; an action that was tantamount to wishing his father dead. Amazingly, the father agrees to his request.

No sooner does he have his share of the money, and he is off, living the high life in a far away country, parties every night, surrounded by many new 'friends'.

Of course, the inevitable happens, his money runs out, and his so-called 'friends' desert him. A famine hits the country and he is literally starving to death and he pleads for someone to give him a job, so he can buy food. Finally, someone agrees to offer him, a Jewish man, a job feeding the pigs - the ultimate insult to someone for whom pigs are religiously 'unclean' animals. But he is desperate and takes the job.

At rock bottom, he finally comes to his senses and remembers that in his father's house even the servants were well-treated. He resolves to go back, renounce his 'sonship', as he knows he is no longer worthy, intending to ask his father to take him on as a slave.

On his way home he rehearses the speech he will make to his father. But his father, who has been constantly hoping for his son's return, sees him and runs to greet him, throws his arms around him, and kisses him. The son begins his speech, but his father interrupts him and he is brought fine clothes and new shoes and a party is to be thrown to welcome him home. This parable of Jesus, is, in a very real sense, the story of every Christian. We have all turned away from our heavenly Father and gone our own way. Maybe most of us don't fall as far from the path as the Prodigal, but it is only a question of degree.

But as soon as we do turn back to God, amazingly, we don't find condemnation and recrimination, but mercy and forgiveness, from a Father who loves us, throws his arms around us and restores us back into his family.

That is the amazing message of Easter. Because of Jesus dying for us on the cross, God's mercy, love, and forgiveness are offered to us.

I wonder, have you turned back to the Father? The churches of Husbands Bosworth exist for one purpose only, to help you know how incredibly you are loved.
