# FOXTON FESTIVAL OF BOA

t is 75 years since the Inland Waterways Festival of Boats took place at Market Harborough in 1950. Historically, the Festival is seen as the first major event to bring the canals and leisure boating to the attention of the public.

The Festival was the first national boat gathering and was hailed as a huge success and widely recognised as the event that kicked off

the canal leisure industry. Over the six days of the event, the Festival attracted 120 craft and an estimated 50,000 visitors to the rally site at Union Wharf, Market Harborough canal basin. To mark the 75th anniversary of this momentous event the Leicestershire Branch of the Inland Waterways Association, supported by Harborough District Council, the Old Union Canals Society, Foxton Museum and the Canal & River Trust are hosting a rally of boats at Foxton Locks over the weekend of Saturday, June 7th and Sunday 8th.



Vibrancy and loads of colour are guaranteed, plus shoals of floating-market traders and hosts of bankside stalls, over twenty historic working boats and a real-ale bar and light refreshments. Throughout the weekend there will be music and entertainment for the whole family across the site - and why not pop into the Museum and see the special displays of images and memories of the original festival in 1950?

The boats will be on the move on Saturday afternoon when there

will be a ceremonial cavalcade of boats to the site of the 1950 rally at Market Harborough basin, and back.

Entry to the Festival is FREE. However, normal car park charges apply: Long Stay (Festival car park) £3 all day.

## **BOSWORTH IN FOCUS**

#### Taking a gander...

A flurry of interest earlier in the year, when a pair of Canada geese set up home on the Millennium Wood pond intensified recently with the appearance of a brood of fluffy goslings. There has always been a presence in the Wood of mallard, heron and the odd kingfisher, but this is the first time that geese have been seen.

As the name suggests the origin of the Canada Goose is northern North America, where they are still a dominant species. Canada geese were first introduced into the UK in the late 17<sup>th</sup> century, as an addition to King James II's waterfowl collection in St. James's Park, and soon became fashionable on country estates as decorative and game birds.

Given their abundance today, it is hard to imagine that until the mid-twentieth century, they were a relatively rare sight. In 1953 the estimated population was less than 4,000 birds, but recent figures from the RSPB suggest that there are as many as 55,000 breeding pairs resident in the UK.

Nominally a migratory bird, the introduced populations soon adapted to a non-migratory life, often living in large permanent hierarchical colonies. Fiercely territorial, with few predators and little competition in their aquatic environment, they have thrived in our temperate climate to the extent that in many public parks, riversides and on waterside farmland they have become a recognised pest. They are particularly enthusiastic herbivores, consuming vast quantities of greenery - hopefully, they will help to clear our woodland pond of the pervasive water-growing grasses and weeds...

#### **SUMMER DREAMIN'**



#### **BYGONE BOSWORTH**

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

This photograph gives us an idea of the popularity of the event as we prepare to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the Inland Waterways Festival of Boats, which took place in Market Harborough in 1950. According to newspaper reports at the time, the event attracted over 50,000 visitors, despite the grey skies and showers - and from this picture it is clear that a fair proportion of the crowds seem to have fetched up at the footbridge (Bridge 14). Another gauge of the extent of the crowding is that the footbridge is fully a half a mile outside the terminal basin, which was the actual focus of the festival.

To get our bearings, the cars in the background are parked along the B6047 Leicester Road, where the lay-by is today. The bridge is no longer there - replaced by a swish road-bridge, which sweeps across the canal at this point today as part of the access agreement for the new William Davis Homes / Taylor-Wimpey development.

#### ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS

#### The Beauty of Tiny Details

Sometimes when reading the Bible, you come across a tiny detail that you almost don't notice, but, which, on investigation, proves to be massively important. One such detail occurs in *Acts Chapter 9*, where we are told that St Peter was staying at the home of Simon, a tanner.

That would have been explosive reading for any Jew, because Jewish religious purity laws stated that contact with dead animals made you ceremonially unclean. So, tanning leather, with the constant contact with animal skins was abhorrent to Jews and tanners were almost always in a state of 'uncleanness'. No other Jew could come near them; they were not allowed to enter a Jewish home, or synagogue. So, for St Peter, staying in the home of a tanner, is massive. It shows that some of the Jewish religious and social barriers were already being broken down in the Christian church.

Now, there is another fascinating tiny detail to notice. We are told this was in the town of Joppa. So, St Peter's journey towards an acceptance that Gentiles could join the Church, began in the town of Joppa. If you know your Old Testament, you will be aware of another unexpected journey towards the Gentiles that begins in Joppa.

The word of the Lord came to Jonah, son of Amittai: "Go to the great city of Nineveh and preach against it, because its wickedness has come up before me." But Jonah ran away from the Lord and headed for Tarshish and went to Joppa where he found a ship bound for that port. In the book of Jonah, his journey towards the Gentiles also begins in Joppa. The amazing story of God's grace coming to the Gentile Ninevites, begins in Joppa.

This is one of those amazing parallels between the Old and New Testaments... God organises some detail, which is of no significance at the time, but which seven centuries later will enable it to be understood in a deeper way and reveal something of His awesome majesty and control of events to reveal Himself and his Heart.

The tiny detail of St Peter's story happening in Joppa connects with the Old Testament story of Jonah, enabling his story to be understood more deeply, and giving early Christians the confidence to reach out to Gentiles themselves.

The tiny detail of Joppa helps to open the Church to people like you and me. If you are a Gentile Christian, this is, at least in part, because of the tiny detail of Joppa! Isn't that beautiful?
