

SCHOOL PLACES

Details of the proposed Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) school earmarked for a site off Kilworth Road are emerging, following the submission of a formal planning application.

Leicestershire County Council is proposing to invest around £30 million in the project, which would create a new specialist school on 13 acres of County Council-owned land adjacent to the village playing field.

The school would be two-storey, and accommodate around 250 pupils aged from four years of age to 19, and employ up to 100 members of teaching and support staff.

The school will address a shortfall in local provision of places for specialist education across South Leicestershire. It would reduce travel-times for those journeying to suitable schools within the county or to out-of-county facilities and reduce pressure where specialist facilities are provided within other areas of the education system. The proposals include a 100-space car park for visitors and staff, sports pitches and a multi-use games area, with supporting documentation suggesting that these facilities may be opened to out-of-hours and wider community use.

The full planning application can be found, and comments made, within the Harborough planning portal, ref. 26/01086/LCC.

Each year seems to get hotter, and yet, somehow, you produced some great results!

The show is a non-profit-making event and has been for the last 140 years, with the support from donations and volunteers. Proceeds from the show are used to fund the following years event, plus where possible donations are made primarily to local community groups. Last year we were able to support *Rainbows* and we hope that we can contribute again to another far-reaching charity in some way.

The heart of the show is not about how much money we make - although this is a fantastic bonus - but about the community coming together and entering into the spirit of light-hearted competition, *(See full show results on p.4)*

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BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Bamboo

Undoubtedly one of the greatest 'show-offs' of introduced non-native plants to be found in UK gardens is bamboo. Despite the plant's woody nature, and ability to grow to a great height, bamboo is in fact a true grass.

Introduced from the Far East in the early 1800s, experimental groves were established, notably at Kew, to determine the plant's hardiness in the UK climate. Whilst the plant's fast growing and exotic appearance attracted gardeners, it was also being considered as a construction material, as it had been for centuries in its native environment. Even today, bamboo is widely used in the Far East, with a web of bamboo scaffolding a common sight encasing modern high-rise buildings and tower blocks that are under construction.

There are hundreds of sub-species, but they are generally classified into two groups - running bamboo and clumping bamboo. This is where the plant's characteristics of growth can be its downfall. Clumping bamboo tends to keep itself to itself, contentedly growing from dense root-stocks, often many years old. Running bamboo is altogether more troublesome - especially if it is growing under the fence in next door's garden... As its name suggests, it has the habit of sending rhizomatous runners, which don't recognise legal boundaries, out from the root-stock, often erupting on your side of the fence, even under paving or concrete. So, keep your bamboo in check... civil law may determine that the grower is responsible for lack of amenity or structural damage caused!

For a plant imported as an exotic addition to a garden, it has got to be said that bamboo flowers are a big let-down. For a start flowering is extremely rare and, instead of fancy petals, the blooms look like weed-grass seed-heads. What's more, the whole process may only happen once in the plant's life, 50 years or more, and takes so much out of the plant that the whole plant often dies!

Village life is often steeped in tradition, as we saw recently with our own Sheepdog Trials and the Horticultural Show. Another feature of tradition that we are blessed with in Bosworth is a fine set of handbells. Did you know that the village has a set of traditional handbells?

Apparently we didn't know... as the *Market Harborough Advertiser & Midland Mail* revealed in March 1954, when they reported that '...a housekeeper, clearing out bits and pieces that had accumulated in odd corners in the Parish Church, found a set of 25 handbells', which inspired the *Mail* to triumphantly declare, '...so began the Husbands Bosworth Ladies Handbell team...'

Since their miraculous 'resurrection', the bells have seen action at many village events, and more recently by the village school children, who have played them at the Christmas Festivals. However, the bells need regular maintenance, and All Saints church, as custodians of the set has recently sent them off to be re-tuned and have their clappers checked at Taylor's Bell Foundry, Loughborough.

Report of the Parish Council Meeting held on Tuesday 4th August 2026

Present: Five Councillors, no members of the public. Apologies received from Cllr. Peel

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved

Matters Arising (for report only)

- Clerk confirmed Notice of Public Rights and AGAR documents were posted on notice boards and website as required

Clerk requested that discussions on waste bins be re-scheduled for the September meeting

Finance

- The monthly schedule of receipts and payments, and bank statements for June and July 2026 were received and confirmed as correct
- Clerk presented a summary of income and expenditure for Quarter 1 2026

Planning Overview

- The June / July 2026 planning applications overview was presented, relating to: 26/00711/PCD, 26/00609/FUL, 26/00704/FUL and 26/00894/PCD
- Review application 2026/Reg3Ma/0071/LCC - SEND School - Council is supportive of the SEND school, however there are certain areas of the application where Council had concerns, including traffic volume and speed management, pedestrian footpath lighting, drainage capacity, minimising the impact of the construction on residents, permissive pathway entrance and water supply to allotments.

Millennium Pavilion

- It was agreed to purchase a workbench and shelving for the garage/store and a hedge trimmer for general use
- Clerk notified Council that a sponsor had agreed to fund a new gate for the Playing Field. Clerk undertook to notify the contractor
- Frieze Project - the artwork was now in place and information plaques were awaiting delivery
- Acoustic panels - Clerk confirmed that the order for acoustic roof panels for the pavilion meeting room had been ordered

Millennium Wood

- Clerk confirmed that the boardwalk project had been completed
- Both interpretation plaques had been delivered to the parish office, and were awaiting installation
- Council agreed to obtain quotes for the repair of the car park hand-gate
- It was agreed that a maintenance plan for the Millennium Wood was required. Clerk to arrange a meeting with the previous contractor

Christmas Tree Quote 2026

- After review it was agreed to accept a quote for the supply, erection and removal of the church Christmas Tree

Dog Walk

- Following reports of unacceptable and threatening behaviour in the Dog Walk it was agreed to source and install a suitable sign

Tree Survey

- Council noted that no work needing immediate action was flagged up in the recent tree survey

Local Government Reorganisation

- Following the recent announcement of the LGR plan for Leicestershire, the council agreed that this was the worst option for Husbands Bosworth and neighbouring districts in South Leicestershire. The impact on this decision for Parish Councils is unknown but, in the meantime, it was agreed the council continue to work as normal for the benefit of our community

Any Other Business

- After discussion, Council agreed to start to gather quotes for converting the present pavilion garage to office space
- Cllr. Forman updated Council on a recent meeting with Canal and River Trust (CRT) concerning setting up a voluntary adoption scheme. Cllr. Forman agreed to try to progress this proposal

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CHURCH NEWS

ALL SAINTS CHURCH NEWS

Our next Parochial Church Council meeting on Thursday, September 3rd, will have a full agenda. Among other things, we will be discussing the progress that has been made in selling the Church Hall, a task that is taking a great deal of time. We thought we were just about clear to proceed with the sale itself (probably at auction) when our attention was drawn to the legislation set out in the Charities Act 2011, which will require a report from a suitably qualified person to confirm that our actions and intentions are the best way to proceed. I'm not sure who might be better qualified than the members of the PCC who have already decided the best option is to sell the hall, but that's modern life for you...

Good news is that approval has been given for repairs to the wall in the north aisle where plaster has fallen away; other repairs noted in the Quinquennial Inspection will be carried out at the same time these being mainly replacing/repairing damaged or missing roof tiles and repointing to make watertight in places where the rain may cause damage - as it did to the plasterwork in the north aisle.

The PCC was delighted to accept a very generous donation by Jen Begley from *Wotnotsandthingamebobs*, an organisation which raises funds for small local charities, which will go towards the refurbishment of the handbells, used by the school at some of their services. Find more information about them by searching for @Wotnotsandthingamebobs on Facebook. Very occasionally a lay person takes a Wednesday service. The appropriate Bible readings and prayers for the day can be found online, but there may be a reluctance to give any kind of sermon, which anyway needs quite some time to prepare and may be difficult to provide at short notice. Stephen March, our curate until last year, has written a considerable number of sermons both short and long which can be found on fuelforpilgrims.wordpress.com and he has kindly agreed that we may use any of these, which will make life easier for the leader and more interesting for the congregation!
